SIMULATED EMERGENCY TEST OCTOBER 16

All AREC members were activated within a relatively short period of time and reported in. The mobiles were assigned various tasks in keeping with their mobility. A simulated total power failure occurred which put 3GX off the air until an APU was obtained. Meanwhile mobile Net control took over. It was a very fast moving and interesting exercise with lots of traffic which lasted about 2 hours. After conclusion of the exercise all stations mobile and fixed were invited to the disaster scene where coffee and donuts were served. Congratulations to 3YC and W2YYP for a fine job in the planning. Also a very hearty thanks to all those who participated for a job well done. Everyone did a fabulous job!
