Editorial by Ed VE3GX Oxfam of Canada is sponsoring it's second "Walk" in the Ottawa region on 20th April 1968, and have again requested that our Club provide assistance. The first event took place 8th April 1967 and was an unqualified success. Each walker had one or more sponsors who pledged to pay so much per mile completed. It was anticipated that a possible 500 walkers might participate, but to everyones surprize, over 4000 registered and started on the walk. The route covered a distance of 40 miles and the walkers were required to check in at each of the 14 check points over the route. 500 walkers completed the 40 mile walk! It was believed that our Club task would consist of providing communications from the check points. We soon found out however that this task was only one of many! Due to the lack of Oxfam planning we were organizing, manning and locating check points, providing communication for the two ambulances, arranging for food and medical attention, locating walkers and lost clothing, arranging for transportation for walkers that could not continue. You name it, we did it! What seemed to be a routine request for communication assistance turned into a real emergency exercise with all the actual problems of a full blown emergency. Our assistance and our saving of the day for OXFAM was not fully recognized. We did not get any favorable publicity for amateur radio to speak of. We did however take solace in the fact that the event would have been a complete failure without us. VE3DMU will be organizing our participation this year and I am sure he will convey with gusto the multitude of constructive suggestions which we are amassing for Gord to present at the April 10th planning meeting. In addition to our Club members VE3DMU Gord will be requesting assistance from individual amateurs and OARC Club members. Mobile equipment manned by amateurs who have many hours to contribute, to say nothing of gasoline, are required. Many of our Club members served continuously for 15 or more hours last year. It is hoped that by virtue of greater numbers participating the hours required will be much less. Your assistance will be a contribution to amateur radio public service as well as to humanity itself. Call Gord if you are interested and will actually and actively participate. Both 75 meters and 2 meter FM will be employed so if you are mobile on either or both bands Gord will be glad to hear from you.
