A number of radio amateurs are purchasing compact VHF monitor receivers capable of monitoring police, fire, taxi and other services in addition to the local FM Repeater, VE2CRA. These units are being used as the receiver portion of an amateur radio hand held walkie-talkie. The D.O.C. has requested me to remind you of the "oath of secrecy" taken by all radio amateurs. It is an offence to divulge any information obtained from non-amateur radio services.

NEW REPEATER IN OPERATION

The Kingston and Belleville Clubs, assisted by a number of Ottawa amateurs put VE3KBR on the air 21/22 March 70. The input and output frequencies are the same as VE2CRA i.e. 146.460 in and 146.940 out. The location is near Roblin, Ontario which is almost equidistant from Kingston and Belleville close to Highway 401. Coverage data is not available at present since only one week has elapsed since the inauguration of the service. The coverage appears to commence at the point where the VE2CRA coverage drops out. It is not anticipated that there will be much mutual interference.

MILES FOR MILLIONS 40 MILE WALK 18 APRIL 70

This will be the fourth annual 40 mile walk to be held in Ottawa. The communications for the first two were entirely by amateur radio. Last year we manned half of the 16 Check-points, G.R.S. did the remainder. This was not a satisfactory arrangement therefore this year amateur radio will again provide the main communications for all the 16 check-points, H.Q. and Net Control Stations and medical vehicles. This operation provides radio amateurs with a wealth of experience since all of the elements of an actual disaster are present. Large volumes of traffic, medical casualties, food, supply, transportation, problems galore! No simulated Emergency Test could even approach this. 50,000 walkers participated last year, even more are anticipated this year. Long hours are necessary to provide the 40 or more shifts necessary. We need a lot of help. The EC and assistants will be contacting you if they haven't already.

MILES FOR MILLIONS NOT CONNECTED WITH OXFAM

After the first Walk in 1967, the Miles for Millions Organization divorced themselves from the OXFAM Organization. A portion of the money raised however did go to the OXFAM Organization coffers, but this year, no funds will be given to them. According to the Miles for Millions Incorporated charter, all funds are destined for Canadian Indians, Metis, Eskimos and to the poor in underdeveloped countries. Administration costs are extremely low under the new set-up.
