Harry VE3BEB: For Services as Pot Hole Net Manager. Doreen VE3CGO: For her services as Monitor Station, typing Rambler envelopes, sending out get well and sympathy cards on behalf of the club. For services as Bulletin Editor, Swap Net Manager, Pot Lid Net Manager, Ed VE3GX: collector of artifacts for the Nuseum, coffee maker, maintainer of VE3JW. George VE3DIH: For services as Operator Procurer, VE3JW for 8 months. For services as new Operator Procurer for VE3JW. Sean VE3HXP: Sydney reviewed the regular meetings of the past year and the 1976 Club Activities and Achievements as follows: 1976 CLUB ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS 24 April 76: Sponsored and organized the Amateur Radio Spring Auction. Very successful! Earned a small profit for the club coffers and at the same time were able to empty some basements and fill others. 76: Club sponsored and organized the communications for the St. John Ambulance Brigade First Aid role in the Metres for Millions Walk. 13 First Aid Posts were provided with communications to Net Control Station located at Brigade The Officer i/c the Brigade operation was provided with continuous communication as he constantly roved over the route. A medical supply vechicle was also provided with communications. 34 Radio Amateurs provided communications in shifts from 7 AM until 1215 AM the following morning. Over \$180,000.00 was raised for charity. 26/27 June 76: Participated in Field Day under the Club call VE3RAM. Operated 2 transmitter class, one CW one SSB. Total contacts 707, Total score 2402. We came 2nd in Ontario, 5th in Canada in a field of 249. Most horrible wx experienced to date. Hail, lots of rain and lightning! 27 August 76: Club BBQ held at the QTH of Heinz VE3GOS. Very well attended and all had a wonderful time. 12 November 76: Annual Club dinner held with YLs and XYLs in attendance. Forty persons enjoyed the repast and repartee. An excellent evening. GENERAL The Club digital clock project was successful. 12 members purchased kits. Three Club members brought us honour in 1976. Heinz VE3GOS for his communication work during the Guatemala disisaster. Ed VE3GX and Doreen VE3CGO were jointly awarded the Radio Society of Ontario Amateur Radio Operator of the Year trophy at the RSO convention held in Toronto 22-24 October 1976. SUMMARY In summary Sydney observed that the Club had a very good year indeed and made the following suggestions: The fall season of 1977 will mark the 20th aniversary of the founding of the Club and that something special should be done to celebrate the occasion. 2. ONTARS CELEBRATES FIFTH BIRTHDAY

8 Jan 77 marked the 5th anniversary of the commencement of the Ontario Amateur Radio Service (ONTARS) operating on 3755 KHZ from 7 AM to 6 PM daily. The father of ONTARS is Bruce Carveth, VE3BC, manager and Chairman of the RSO Communications Committee for the same 5 year period. Bruce watched over his prodigy with a dedication that will be hard to match by successors. Doreen VE3CGO had been monitoring 3760 KHZ 7 days a week 8 AM to 6 PM for over 13 years prior to the implementation of ONTARS. Bruce used to call her at various times during the early evening to exchange ideas on the implementation of ONTARS. I think that Bruce was secretly surprised that our Monitoring Service worked so well because Doreen was always on deck when he called. Doreen continued the Monitoring Service 8 months after the implementation of ONTARS and had frequent traffic referrals from ONTARS for Ottawa one or two-ways. In October 1972 it was decided to terminate the 3760 KHZ Club Monitoring Service in view of the fact that ONTARS was doing such a good job. The Club Service was well known throughout Ontario and Quebec and provided a reliable traffic outlet for fixed stations as well as for the 75 meter mobiles for which it was originally established in May 1959. (The two meter service commenced in August 67 and continues to date)

I am sure that it was with mixed emotions that Bruce VE3BC relinguished the tender loving care of ONTARS 8 Jan 77. I am also sure that Bruce will be standing in the wings ready to lend a hand when required. Many thanks Bruce for your devotion to the job, as we say in our Club, three doffs of our mobile whips. Also thanks to the Assistant Managers, and controllers without whom the Service could not operate. Bill Finlay VE3CLK succeeded Bruce as ONTARS Manager as of 8 Jan 77.
