REPORT ON THE LAST MEETING

Larry VE3CRX gave a very interesting talk on Amateur Radio communications for the Canadian Ski Marathon which is an annual 2 day 100 mile event starting in Lachute P.Q. and ending in Hull P.Q. The route is through sparsely settled terrain with many 2 meter VHF path obstructions thereby creating a challenge to those providing the valuable service. This years event 27/28 February will mark the 4th year of Amateur Radio participation. Each year brings improvements. This year is no exception since 5 of the 6 daily check points will be equipped with teletype terminals operating over the 2 meter FM system which will expedite traffic. When one considers that each of the many thousands of skiers is identified by a number and must be checked through each check-point with individual times to say nothing of of emergency, accommodation and logisitic traffic, the volume is horrendous. In addition to the 6 check-points, there are other fixed stations and mobiles participating. A most commendable effort and clearly a demonstration of what Amateur Radio can do under adverse conditions. Many thanks Larry for your in-depth talk which provided a very graphic picture of one of the very valuable services that Amateur Radio provides for community and country.
