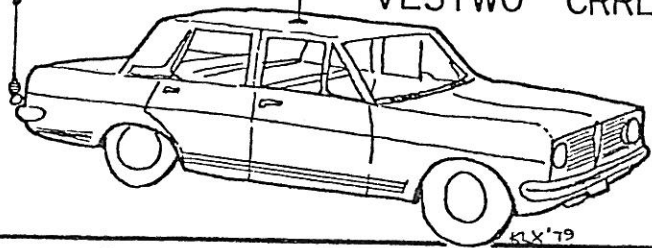

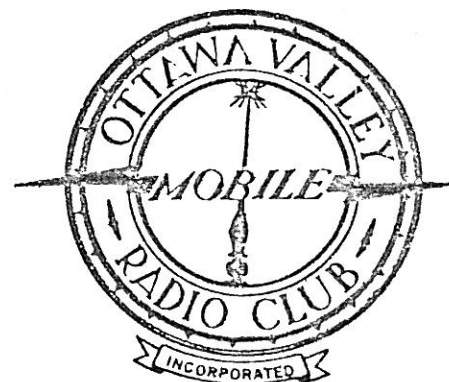

OVMRC SEP GENERAL MEETING MINUTES - A motion was presented by 3BDO to accept the minutes, as published in the Rambler. Seconded by 3JQW. 3JQW stated that the HW101, for 3JW, has been built and is being aligned at present. We should be receiving it from Heathkit shortly. 3LAR gave a report on the BBQ and indicated that we had gone \$9.00 overbudget. 3DVH stated that there was \$676.21 in the bank. 3FSN indicated that the new repeater construction is going well and hopes to have the antenna up before snow flies. 3FHC reminded everyone to check to ensure their membership list information was correct. 3KMG advised the membership that it is now costing around \$30.00 a month to print the Rambler.

The Club received a letter, from DOC, asking us to submit new exam questions for future Amateur exams. 3FHC presented a motion that 3LAR chair a committee to produce our club submission - seconded by 3FSN - - Carried. 3LAR updated everyone on the upcoming RSO convention. He indicated he still requires volunteers to assist with the talk-in on 2M and to assist in setting up and operating the hospitality suite. A motion was made by 3BDO requesting the Club Executive formulate a letter to Mr Crosbie, Minister of Finance, requesting their support in getting the "Hobby articles and Collectables tarriff bill" placed before Parliament as early as possible. Seconded by 3ET. 3CDC addressed the membership on the CARF symposium 2-4 Nov 79 at Montreal. He suggested that there were 4 positions available for our club to send representatives. Some of the subjects to be discussed are: frequencies and policies, powers of DOC/MOT ref towers, exams, digital and computer comms and callsigns and licence procedures.

3DVH gave a very interesting talk/demo on his other hobby of Remote Control Model Aircraft flying. He had his complete outfit along. A very interesting talk. Thank you Mike.

CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT- The club constitution was amended and approved except for one paragraph, in March 79. This paragraph has now been rewritten and will be voted on at the Oct general meeting. If this amendment is approved, the final constitution will be printed and distributed as soon as possible. The new article 3 paragraph 6 now reads:

6. Life membership- the club may confer a Life membership on any Radio Amateur in or from the Ottawa area who, through his/her Amateur radio activities, has made an outstanding contribution to the community or the Amateur Radio Service. Any such individual will be considered by the club provided that he/she has been nominated by at least three licenced club members, who have been members in good standing for at least five years, plus at least one member of the executive. A statement of intent to confer a Life membership must be published in the Rambler and be voted on at the next regular meeting of the club. Voting on Life membership shall be taken by secret ballot and will require the support of at least 2/3 of the licenced club members attending the meeting, in order to be adopted. The Life member shall be granted full membership privileges.

AMATEUR PROFILE - by Dave 3KLX
