Rallies Need You!

For the last several years I have become involved in car rallying, through the Motorsport Club of Ottawa (MCO), and RallySport Ontario (RSO). Most recently I received my Basic qualification. There is a fair amount of HAM involvement in the rally scene, mainly because we tend to run away from the populated centres, in hilly terrain, well out of cell ranges. HAM is so important in rallying to the organizers and workers that many rallyists, like myself, obtain at least a Basic qualification to meet the needs of rallying.

As you may guess, we work pretty exclusively on 2m mobile rigs, and a variety of simplex or repeater usage. Some may go on to an Advanced qualification. Larger rally clubs in the G.T.A. are well established in the usage of HAM radio, but the MCO has not reached this level. Notably, every spring, RSO gives a weekend course (after some pre self-study period), this year graduating 12 new amateurs. Slowly MCO members are seeing the benefits of HAM radio for rallying and we are obtaining licenses, but we require your assistance.

We are running three club events this fall. First is Golden Pine Rally, from Golden Lake, on October 5. Second event is Lanark Highlands, a fundraiser rally for the Lanark County Therapeutic Riding Association, out of Almonte, on October 19. Last, is the Mississippi Valley Rally, also out of Almonte, on November 9 (night time). If you are interested in seeing how a rally works, and want to help us make it work better, please let me know! Clayton Jenkins (VE3CBJ), Mike Kelly (VE3FFK), and others whom I have forgotten the names of, have already helped us once, and they may be able to also fill you in on our type of event. I am very receptive to discussing anything you wish to ask about rallying and HAM radio.
