### General Meeting, Sept 21/06

Started at 1950 by Larry VE3WEH. Approx 33 people attending.

New amateur Dave VE3AAQ looking for votes to get the RAC North/East Director position.

Question from floor – Why are certain satellites still being tracked? Answer – All space junk and approx 8000 satellites are tracked to avoid damage to rockets taking off with cargo. i.e. – Space Shuttle. Also used for warning when they finally reenter Earth from orbit.

VE3JW Lighthouse Contest (Aug18-20/06) presentation by Larry VE3WEH. This excellent well detailed computer slide show showed how a trailer was set up near the Museum lighthouse. Various pictures were shown of the rig/antenna set up and operation by various operators. 61 contacts (13 DX) were made using the callsign CAN 865 (M).

Ken Gill VA3KJG (Treasurer) presented the new budget put together by the executive for the year 2006-07. Before being accepted various questions ensued in that to lower the deficit should certain items such as the autopatch, trailer generator and Web software could be taken out.

Re the autopatch certain manners in how to get users to pay on individual call, members only, etc came forth. Pros were that the repeater location did have emergency power available and that the patch was there for outside emergency use. Decided was that the budget would be accepted with

certain actions to require further investigation.

Those were as follows:

- 1) Put forward by VE3TCSC, 2<sup>nd</sup> by VE3SPC pass present budget with autopatch use to be further examined.
- 2) Put forward by VE3STL, 2<sup>nd</sup> by VA3GLT pass budget with more detailed required into purchase of Web software when there is lots of free ones available.
- 3) Put forward by VE3VIG, 2<sup>nd</sup> by VA3DWC pass budget but more info needed on the amount for repeater's costs (why, what for, what is required, etc).

Motion for budget to be accepted put forward by VE3QND, 2<sup>nd</sup> by VE3VIG. Majority voted to accept.

Oct general meeting – mini fleamarket Oct 19/06 between 1900-2000. Limit of 2 cardboard cases (beer size) with items to be labeled for cost and owner. First come, first serve. Sellers pay 20% of profits to club. Only club members can sell.

WARNING – in the last month the President and Vice-President have resigned due to timing restraints requiring their presence elsewhere. So far no volunteers have come forward. Please ask anyone you know of they would be interested for such a position. Also soon required will be another person for Treasurer.

Mention was made of new Ottawa City zoning bylaw to be put into effect in 2007. Some input was put in by RAC members hoping it will have an effect on how it is worded. This bylaw can have action on how home antennas can be erected thus affecting radio amateurs.

OVMRC radio course, Tues Oct 3 – so far 15 people have shown interest. Course fees are \$250.

### JERRY WELLS AWARD OVMRC AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

The OVMRC Inc. has established the • Fostering good will and understand-Jerry Wells Award in 1997 in recognition of Jerry Wells VE3CDS, 1928-1997, a live member and Silent Key. Jerry received the "Amateur of the Year Award in June 1997 for his contribution of time, effort and devotion throughout the year to the Amateur Radio Course, his work as Delegated Examiner and his management of Amateur Radio Station, VE3JW, at the Canada Science and Technology Museum. The Award was subsequently renamed the "Jerry Wells OVMRC Amateur of the Year Award in his honour.

Please read the Award criteria before completing the nomination form.

#### **Selection Criteria and Process**

The submission of nominees and selection of the award winner will be based on the following criteria.

Each nominee for the award must have been a fully paid up member of the OVMRC and a licensed Radio Amateur during the most recently completed club fiscal year starting July 1, 2004 and ending June 30, 2005 (Award Year).

Nomination must be received in writing, in the required format, prior to, or during the regular November meeting. Each nomination must be supported by not less than two Full Members who were in good standing during the Award Year, and must include a short narrative description of the nominee's contribution to Amateur Radio as specified below:

To be eligible, nominee must have made a significant contribution during the Award Year to further any of the objectives of the OVMRC by:

- Contributing to the interest, study and progress of the science and art of Amateur Radio with particular emphasis on mobile operations;
- Co-operating with and assisting the civil authorities to the fullest extent possible in any emergency; or by

ing among Radio Amateurs.

The eligibility of nominees will be verified by the Executive.

The names of the nominees and the short narrative descriptions provide by the nominators will be published in the December issue of the Rambler.

The Award winner will be determined by SECRET BALLOT by all members attending the regular meeting held in December. Two Full Members in good standing who are not nominees or nominators will be appointed by the President to scrutinize and tabulate the ballots.
