Ken started his presentation with a video "Ice Storm 1998" to demonstrate an example where emergency communications are a necessity.

A maritime search and rescue exercise is to be held the weekend of 22, 23 September 2007. It consists of the evacuation of a passenger vessel off the West coast of Newfoundland.

The ground search and rescue group are recruiting and plan to hold a course on Tuesday 2 October 2007. Membership is \$20 and the cost of the course is \$125. Refer to the web site for details. A recent ground search and rescue was held near Wakefield, Quebec where the group spent four days and nights to locate a missing Alzheimer patient.

An exercise is being held the weekend of 22, 23 September 2007 near Rockland, Ontario. This will be a crash recovery exercise using newly acquired night vision equipment.

A joint Canada/U.S.A. exercise is being held the weekend of 28, 29, 30 September 2007 at Fitzroy provincial park. A local army reserve unit will also be involved. Refer to the web site for details.

Joint CDA/USA Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Preparedness Event

Fitzroy Provincial Park, Ontario was the venue for the demonstration of co-operation between Amateur Radio and the Reserve 763 Communication Regiment.

DEPLOYMENT

On Friday 28 September 2007 the Ottawa Valley Mobile Radio Club communication trailer was driven to Fitzroy Provincial Park about a one hour drive north of Ottawa. Upon previous request, the park superintendent Mr. Dave Noonan had reserved the entire northern end of the "overflow" area of the park for us for the duration of the exercise.

We had plenty of room in a nice flat area to place the trailer and erect one B&W multi-band 1.8-30 Mhz folded dipole in an inverted "V" configuration.

A GP-3 VHF/UHF antenna was rigged at the back of the trailer and provided us with access too a few of the local repeaters and to the IRLP. A new Champion 2800 Watt generator provided flawless AC power throughout the exercise.

By mid afternoon on Friday the 28th the OVMRC "detachment" consisting of Ken Halcrow, VE3SRS, Steve Cochran, VE3SBC, Barney Baker, VA3BGB and Stan Peters, a good friend of Ken, was exercise ready.

At about 10PM on Friday evening the 763 Communication Regiment Detachment consisting of three panel trucks with trailers and four reserve personnel arrived. Thanks to a crystal clear and very bright full moon the process of setting up the operations and accommodation shelter and four antennas took about three hours. It was interesting to watch the process as no bright lights were used during the whole operation. Tactical was the word.

Our two detachments were located about 50 meters apart with a 2 wire field phone connecting the two sites. Every opportunity throughout the weekend was taken to talk to, listen to and observe how 763 Communication Regiment goes about the business of setting up and operating a portable HF capability. The HF detachment erected two B&W antennas, one NVIS antenna and a 32' whip.

OPERATIONS

After a quick breakfast of eggs and ham slices on Saturday morning 29 September we commenced operations. Throughout the day band conditions on HF were poor to fair with no contact on voice with VO1ARES on any of the assigned frequencies. We did, however, have very good VHF connect to the Lavant repeater VE3KJG on 146.640 which hosts the IRLP node 2947. Norm Hagen VE3VY monitors the Lavant repeater and we had numerous chats throughout the day including attempts at peer to peer PACTOR connections. The Lavant IRLP node was also used to connect to Kingston IRLP node 2750 to set up successful CFARS contacts on voice and PACTOR mode keyboard peer to peer on frequency Yankee. As the bands changed in evening PACTOR connects to VO1CRC and VE1YZ were very successful with exercise messages received from VO1EMO/VO1ARES and forwarded (simulated) to addressees in the Ottawa area. Sunday morning 30 September proved very good for HF conditions on CFARS Yankee frequency with PACTOR peer to peer connects again made to Les Lindstrom VE3KFS/CIW650 in Kingston and Cliff Fairbank VA3CAF/CIW681 in Frankford on voice. Since Amateur Radio band conditions on 40/20 meters were also good espe-

cially with 14.325Mhz VO1ARES. The good band conditions also provided an excellent opportunity to train the 763 Communication Regiment operators on amateur radio equipment, antennas, software and NTS message form and procedures. Additional messages received in PACTOR were also received and passed (simulated) to Ottawa addressees. On Sunday 30 September at 1530Z we closed down operations in order to pack up both detachments and proceed back to Ottawa.

SUMMARY

The Joint Canada/USA Amateur Radio **Emergency Communications Preparedness** Event was an excellent opportunity to vacate the comforts of the home based Ham shack and head for the bush. The pre-planning, equipment preparation and logistics of such and event gets the adrenalin pumping. The co-operation from the Commanding Officer Major Major Geoff Blair and his staff at 763 Communication Regiment was outstanding. Past, present and future exercises of this nature are very important as it demonstrates to those who make the critical decisions in emergencies that Amateur Radio does play an important role in the nations Emergency Preparedness posture.
