IMPORTANT

Upcoming April 17 meeting. RAMBLINGS

I return, if very briefly this time, to a theme that has predominated in most of my contributions to The Rambler, our view of what the OVMRC now is and what we would have it be. As I approach the end of my tenure as president of the club, I have several observations that I would share with you, most very positive.

In terms of activities, the OVMRC appears quite healthy, the range of things we do, extensive. With the implementation of proposed minor changes in club structure, discussed elsewhere in this issue, we may look forward to an even wider scope of projects for the next year. Hopefully, we will hear more about the digital side of things. Also, with rapidly growing interest in portable operation within the club, we may expect increased participation in field events, including direction finding. In general, the coming year, this spring included, should be exciting.

The objective that underlies all changes in the club, existing and proposed, is to make the OVMRC more attractive and more accessible. Another goal is to more greatly involve the membership at large in decision-making and implementation of projects. More concretely, our unusually large Executive Committee (15 positions, about 50 percent of the average

number of members at regular meetings) has led to a de facto bipartite division in the club, i.e. the Executive and everybody else. Such a division, especially with our numbers, induces a kind of passivity on the part of non-executive members who have come to rely more than appropriate on officers and standing committee chairpersons. This attitude is most apparent at times when volunteers are sought for projects or positions. By encouraging committee chairpersons to go outside the Executive for assistance, we hope to encourage more participation by members. Appreciative as I am to have worked this year with positive and committed people, I hope that there will be a healthy number of new faces on our next Executive. *

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND PROPOSALS FROM THE EXECUTIVE

During recent months, the Executive Committee of OVMRC (EC) has created three new awards that may be presented annually for special accomplishments and/or services to the club or to the community that are related in some way to amateur radio. Although the concrete form of the following three awards has not been specified, it is understood that, for the present, announcements of recipients will be made at the June Annual General meeting along with presentation of certificates.

President's Award

In recognition of accomplishments or services related to amateur radio, the president of OVMRC may issue a special award to the person of her/his choice, whether or not that recipient is a member of the club and whether or not that recipient holds an amateur radio license.

Public Service Award

As selected by an ad hoc awards subcommittee, the composition of which to be determined by the EC, an award may be presented to a recipient or group of recipients who are members in good standing of OVMRC for outstanding service to the community wherein that service is related in some way to amateur

radio. Rather than list examples of what such service might comprise, the possibilities so numerous, it is understood that, to qualify for this award, the service must be recognized as genuinely outstanding. In short, traditional activities such as Santa at the Museum of Science and Technology will not normally be considered.

Most Innovative Project Award

As selected by an ad hoc awards subcommittee, the composition of which to be determined by the EC, an award may be presented to a recipient or group of recipients who are members in good standing of OVMRC for completion of a project or undertaking, technical or social, that concerns something new and useful. This award was initially proposed as a means of recognizing the efforts of club members that might otherwise go unacknowledged.

Several changes to current OVMRC practice and structure as set forth in the bylaws have been considered by the EC and are here presented as Due Notice of Motions, to be presented at the next regular meeting of the club, April 17. Where changes in bylaws are involved, the existing version of a bylaw will be given, followed by the proposed modification that will form part of a specific motion.

Membership Fees

Since annual membership fees of OVMRC exceed those levied by most other amateur radio clubs in Ontario, and since the financial status of OVMRC in no way requires that elevated fees be charged, and since the EC wishes to acknowledge the special status of persons who wish to remain affiliated with OVMRC as associate members who no longer participate actively in club affairs, the EC proposes:

- 1. That annual fees for regular members of OVMRC be twenty dollars.
- 2. That annual fees for Associate members be ten dollars.

3. That members, regular and associate, as well as life-time members be eligible to receive issues of The Rambler in whatever form the newsletter is available at no cost.

Requirements for membership in OVMRC

Current status

2.1.1 Full Member

Full Membership on submission of an application and payment of dues, is open to any licensed Radio Amateur having an interest in mobile amateur radio operations and activities.

To allow greater participation by persons who do not currently hold amateur radio licenses, the EC proposes instead:

2.1.1 Full Member

Full Membership on submission of an application and payment of dues, is open to anyone having an interest in mobile amateur radio operations and activities.

Current status

2.1.3 Associate Member

Associate Membership, on submission of an application and payment of dues is open to anyone not holding an Amateur Radio license, having an interest in mobile amateur radio.

2.2 Rights and privileges

2.2.3 Associate Members

Associate Members may neither hold office nor vote on any matter put before the Club.

To allow associate members to be licensed amateurs and to entitle said members to full privileges except those specified in the proposed bylaw, the EC proposes two changes:

2.1.3 Associate Member

Associate Membership, on submission of an application and payment of dues is open to anyone having an interest in mobile amateur radio.

In order to meet the financial and legal obligations of the OVMRC (Inc.) the undersigned was requested to complete a financial audit of the OVMRC accounts for the period covering 01 July 2006 to 30 June 2007. On 24 January 2008 the files and reports were obtained from the OVMRC treasurer Mr. Robert Plante.

AUDIT METHODOLOGY

During the period 1-8 Feb 2008 a financial audit of the OVMRC accounts was conducted. The financial transaction documentation consisted of the following files and reports:

AUDIT RESULTS



Moving forward on The Champlain Trail



In last month's Rambler informed on the progress preparations activating The Champlain Trail from Quebec City Pembroke. Since then, we have been very busy in contact-

ing all the clubs along the way, inviting them to participate, and in obtaining permission from municipalities (and NCC) to set up at the different locations.

14 Clubs have been contacted and they all have acknowledged with a return email saying they will present the project at their next Club Meeting. Of these, 8 Clubs have already submitted volunteer operator's names, the Montreal UMS has offered the RAQI emergency trailer complete with R7 antenna, and the Sorel CRAST has offered a table at their monster Fleamarket on 25 May for OVMRC to showcase our project.

Responses from municipalities and NCC are slowly coming in. The Pembroke "Champlain Trail Museum" will be very happy to host us on their grounds. The Quebec City and Ottawa Champlain monument sites are still in the balance. We're keeping our fingers crossed. Some organizations have standard forms to fill out, requesting a lot of information regarding the project. I've already completed the ones for the NCC and the 5 pages 'formulaire' for Quebec City.
