THIS YEAR'S OVMRC COURSE

The course is going ahead once more this year with registration at the Museum of Science and Technology on the evening of 27 September. To ensure its success I am asking each member of the OVMRC reading this to be a salesperson for the course and encourage any one they feel may be interested to look at the "Radio Course" section of the Club's website that has just been updated. This personal assistance on the part of Club members will be of real help in having a good enrolment.

In response to suggestions from last year's class the course is being expanded to encompass more practical work and on-air time. The additional activities will be conducted on several Thursday evenings in addition to the usual Tuesday evening lectures covering theory, regulations and other topics required by the Department of Industry syllabus. We feel that the extra activities will be of interest to licensed amateurs as well, so are opening them to these individuals at a reduced fee.

The building projects will be the construction of a test setup for a PicAXE 20X2 micro controller and several tutorials by Bob Shaw, VE3SUY, on the programming of it to demonstrate various

elementary applications to show its capabilities and ultimately to use it as a Morse code trainer and practice rig. Having learned to program the micro controller, it can be subsequently used for other projects as desired by the student. For a more complete description of the project please see the radio course section of the OVMRC website (ovmrc.on.ca).

A second more mundane project, particularly for the course students, will be the making of a coax jumper cable with UHF connectors of each end so that they learn how to successfully put a connector on a piece of RG 58.

The on-air sessions will be held at VE3JW. This is a very well equipped station having short-wave, satellite and digital capabilities. The sessions will be conducted by volunteer amateur operators who are Museum volunteers.

The student fees of \$400 include a comprehensive manual, specialized additional printed material, initial project materials, a year's membership in The Radio Amateurs of Canada, a copy of the RAC Operating Manual and membership in the OVMRC to the end of the following June. The fees for licensed amateurs participating in the Thursday evening sessions are \$100 including the initial project materials.

Hello and I hope you all had a good summer. As you may be aware RAC was at Dayton and it was the first time I have been back there in 20+ years. If you have been there you know it's an Amateurs Paradise, and if you haven't been put it on the list. If you do go next year please stop at the RAC booth and say hello.

Moving forward there are multiple things going on with RAC in Ontario. The first one is the Distracted Driving Legislation and RAC's attempt to get a specific exemption for Amateurs. We are still hoping to get a meeting with the policy Advisor to Ms Wynne and explain why we want an exemption. If you can get a letter from a local organization, NGO or group explaining how Amateurs help your community please send me a copy. There are other plans in the work and they will be unrolled as needed. We need to get Amateur Radio on bureaucrat's radar.

Another task force under RAC has been formed to update how the RAC Field Services operate in Ontario. Ontario is a large and diverse province and emergency preparedness is not the same for Thunder Bay as is Toronto. We need to be able to accommodate all regions. So some changes will be made to the Field Organization. Stay tuned.

RAC Bulletin 2011-024E **RAC Task Force to Seek** an Exemption for Ontario Amateurs.

2011-08-09

At its Annual General Meeting in St. John's, Newfoundland, Radio Amateurs of Canada announced that a task force has been formed to seek a permanent exemption for Ontario Amateurs from the ban on operating mobile devices in a vehicle under Article 5 in Ontario Regulation

366/09 made under the Highway Traffic Act. It is also commonly known as the Distracted Driving Legislation. The ban would take effect on January 1, 2013.

The task force is composed of Steve Pengelly, VE3STV, Former Honorary Legal Counsel, Ian Snow, VA3QT, Special Advisor to RAC, Jeff Stewart, VA3WXM, Southern Ontario Regional Director, Marcel Mongeon, Honorary Legal Counsel, VA3DDD, Geoff Bawden, VE4BAW, President and Chair RAC, and ex officio to the Task Force. It is chaired by Bill Unger, VE3XT, Ontario North/East Director.

The Task Force has already obtained letters of support from groups that we assist ranging from hospitals, communities, agencies and NGO's. All of the letters indicate that limiting Radio Amateurs.

ability to provide communications while mobile would not be in the Ontario's best interests. If you would like to submit a letter of support from an external group to the RAC Task Force, please contact the chair Bill Unger.

The Task Force will present the letters as part of our case to Kathleen Wynne, Ontario.s Minister of Transportation, that Amateur Radio operators in Ontario should be exempt from this regulation. The objective of the Distracted Driving Task Force is to convince the Ontario Government that the regulation, as currently written, will actually decrease public safety in Ontario.

Amateur Radio Operators provide countless hours of public service work in their communities and by doing so we are prepared to assist with communications in the event of an overload or total failure or the existing telecommunications infrastructure. The change in the regulations that RAC will request, would align Ontario with seven other provinces and one territory that have introduced exemptions which allow Amateurs to operate while mobile.

The RAC Task Force will shortly initiate discussions with officials in the Minister's Office on the need for Geoff Bawden, VE4BAW this regulatory change.

At the last CARAB meeting between RAC and Industry Canada on May 17, 2011, two of the major items discussed were updates to Industry Canada's regulatory documents (RBR-4 and RIC-3), and the RAC request for an assignment of certain frequencies in the 60m (5 MHz) band to the amateur service in Canada. Neither of these subjects was finalized at the time of the meeting, but Industry Canada undertook to respond to RAC on both ofthem this summer.

Industry Canada has now informed RAC that at this point is sees no reason not to respond favourably to the RAC request for frequencies at 60m on a no protection, non-interference basis.

The new frequencies would be included in the schedule of amateur frequencies in the updated edition of RBR-4 to be released for public consultation in the future. Public submissions will be considered by Industry Canada in preparation for the final version of RBR-4. Any new frequencies it contains would become available to Canadian amateurs at the time

of release of the updated RBR-4. Thus, if all goes well, Canadian amateurs may expect to gain access to frequencies at 60m, basically the same as those in the US, some time this fall.

The anticipated success of this initiative is the result of many months of effort from the RAC executive and volunteers, including the HF Band Planning Committee, and also from all of those amateurs who have made observations on the use of these frequencies and relayed their comments to RAC on the need for this band in Canada. We would not have been successful without all of your help and input.
