November 17, 2011

3.1 Canadian Astronomy in Chile

University of Toronto Southern
Observatory located at Las
Campanas in the Chilean Andes. In
addition to making astronomical
observations, his many duties,
while posted there, included
maintaining and repairing scientific
equipment, setting up equipment
for visiting astronomers and
training staff. The climate of the
surrounding Atacama Desert
provides an ideal environment for
using telescopes because of the
paucity of atmospheric and light
pollution.

Alan talked about the international program in astronomy undertaken from Las Campanas. He described

Alan VE3LNH, former president of the Club during 1988-89, presented an illustrated talk entitled Telescope Diaries, South American Wanderings and the Las Campanas Canadian Observatory, 1979-90.

For over an hour, Alan discussed his many professional experiences and personal adventures while posted during 1979-80 to the the unique Canadian apparatus, a 60-cm Cassegrain (folded) telescope. He also described telescopes erected in the vicinity by a number of other countries. He showed a wealth of photographs that he took, including some of the moon, of Orion, of the Lagoon Nebula, of Neptune and of Uranus. Alan discussed his experiences and adventures within the context of the

history, geography and politics of Chile. He also commented on the local weather, on the flora and on the fauna.

In 1987, Ian Keith Shelton discovered a supernova (SN 1987A) in the Large Magellanic Cloud while working at the Canadian observatory. This supernova was visible with the naked eye. In 1992, the Canadian telescope was named the Helen Sawyer Hogg Telescope. In 1997, program cuts resulted in the closure of the (Continued on page 3)
