

# Have you checked your antenna?

The warm weather and the following rain turning to freezing rain left a beautiful crystal image on all of our trees. I enjoyed the scenery as I walked around our neighbourhood. Until this morning when I looked out the window and noticed my LDG S9v43 was leaning too much in the gentle breeze.

That's when I saw the shining crystal covering on one side of the S9v43 fibre glass pole. Over one half of the vertical was iced. Fix it or lose it was my immediate thought. Now if you are following the weather in Ottawa to day the morning temp was around -15C and falling steadily to -31C tonight with increasing wind. It was not going to get better, the winter thaw has come and gone, spring is months away and if it breaks now it's time, dollars and no radio for a while, maybe until Spring. It was too risky to not try fixing it now.

So it was out into the cold to lower the pole. Sounds straight forward however we had installed a new gazebo frame in front of where I usually (not often) lowered the 43 foot mast. This made the space to 'lower' the antenna to about 6 inches between the frozen cedar hedge and the gazebo frame. The fibre glass pole is light but its length makes it difficult to hold, especially in breezy conditions. Next off with the ground wire, loosen the spare coils of coax, raise the pole 20 inches off it's in the ground base pole and lower it slowly at first through the narrow opening. The slowly at first changed to quickly as the vertical angle changed to horizontal until it

accelerated to the ground sideswiping the clothesline and other gazebo frame followed by a "soft" landing in the snow.

However the lowering exercise was not without its excitement and near misses. The cramped base position required me to straddle the pole as I lowered it. If you have a fundamental knowledge of a levers, long end/short end over the fulcrum, well the short end came up faster than I imagined and the next words can be yours:

, tears freeze fast in cold conditions.

To my surprise and thankfulness it took only a light taping of a hammer and the ice peeled of nicely.

Getting the pole back up was easier than lowering it because I was able to start lifting it in the middle and walk it into the vertical position before placing it back on its ground post. Putting, more like fumbling, the ground wire connected in -19C temperature was a humbling/bumbling experience. I really now appreciate the physical effort/endurance of those service personnel who have to work in extreme (cold) conditions.

Now I am more aware of my radio infrastructure and its continuing maintenance.
