Meeting Minutes Jan 16th, 2015

Call to order 19:30 hrs by President, Sandy/VE3HAZ.

Introduction of guest speaker, Bryan Rawlings/VE3QN.

Mr. Rawlings presentation titled "The Quest for Sixty Metres", describing how the international amateur radio community has been pursuing an amateur band near 5 MHz for the past two decades. This whole international gathering of the ITU is a serious representation of managing the radio spectrum. Although it is seemingly a slow moving decision making process the diplomatic tie wearing Ham reps and associated IC personnel from Canada are achieving their objectives. A hearty thank you was given to Bryan for his informative presentation.

Attendance: about 18 members were present including 5 recently graduates of the OVMRC radio course.

Congratulations was extended to these new graduates:

Eric Burgin/VE3EZE; Kelly Walsh/VE3llX; Eric Paque/VA3KAQ; Tim Orange/VA3ZZW; and Leo Yull/VA3YYL.

The radio course was under the guidance of Norm Rashleigh, VE3LC. Norm restructured the course presentation and condensed it to less than 5 months. 12 of the original 16 students received their call signs ranging from Basics, Basics with honours and basics with honours advanced. Norm was supported by Mike/VE3FFK, Ernie/VE3EJJ and Darin/VE3OIJ. Now Norm is recuperating in Florida for a well-deserved rest. It was agreed Norm and his team did an excellent job and we thank them for their participation.

Harold//VE3UNK, spoke of the upcoming 49th Canadian Ski-Marathon and the participation of and need for amateur radio operators. These personnel provide an essential service, coordination and safety for this very popular event. Although the hours are long the experience is rewarding for all. Sandy/VE3HAZ update the meeting on the current CSTM status regarding the OVMRC assets removal from the museum. Commencing on Jan 19th or there about, special museum personnel in HAZMAT suits will move and dismantle VE3JW and other OVMRC material. decontaminate the items and deliver them for OVMRC to pick up. All this has to be done for all museum artifacts by the end of March this vear. After that time the reconstruction begins to create a 'new' look museum. . Our responsibility will be to pick up the items, sort them for keep, sell or throw away, then find storage space for the duration until we re-establish VE3JW back at the new Science and Technology museum.

Following along with updates Sandy outlined that OVMRC will be granted meeting space for the coming future at the aviation and space museum. A slight increase in our rental of about 25% is anticipated. Which is about \$40 for the year. So if we increase our membership by just 2 people it's paid for, so go out and recruit.

We are still waiting for feedback from CASM regarding Maurice-André's proposed project for a 'Control Tower' exhibit at the aviation and space museum. We will again inquire about this proposal to keep it alive and on the books. The CASM management has indicated a desire to have such an exhibit funding and time seem to be the hurdles not the idea and willingness of people like Maurice-André to make it happen.

Next month our regular meeting (Feb 19th) will be our annual flea market. Come early (19:00 hrs) to set up if you have items to sell or trade. Doors open at 19:30 hrs.

A motion for OVMRC to donate annually to DARF was moved by Guy/ VE3VCF and seconded by Robert/VA3AOD. Motion was passed with majority vote, 3 abstentions. No amount was suggested at this time.

Door prizes were 2 Tm Horton gift cards and a donated a 1994 ARRL hard cover hand book were won by: gift card by David/VE3ZZU, gift card by ??? and the 1994 ARRL hand book by ErnieVE3EJJ who presented it to Robert/VA3AOD

The 50/50 draw worth \$28.00 was won by David/VE3ZZU who donated it to DARF. The OVMRC also matched its portion of the 50/50 (\$28.00) to DARF.

Meeting adjourned around 21:00 hrs.

What a nice surprise for all those attending to receive a large white coffee mug with the official club crest, Ottawa Valley Mobile Radio Club Incorporated and the words "40 Years" written below the crest! What a cake! I hope you were one of the 55 people attending our history making General Meeting held on March 28, 2002 when we celebrated the 40th year of the Incorporation of the OVMRC. It was a very memorable occasion to say the least. Congratulations to all those involved in preparing this meeting! Our President and Vice-President's ingenuity in putting together a memorable and appropriate celebration was impressive.

Many of our honoured Life Members were in attendance. President Dan Johnston VA3JAR, honoured them and invited them to stand and introduce themselves. Many other guests were also acknowledged. We were especially honoured to have Jerry Erland VE3BBY, the first President of the OVMRC, attending. Dan invited Jerry to stand and paid tribute to him as one of the founding members of the OVMRC. His name is spelled with a "J" and he is listed officially as Jerzy Erland on the Canadian and QRZ Callsign data bases.

The CW Contest and QLF (Quick Left Foot!) competition was one of the highlights of the evening with many participants under the watchful eyes of the judges. Dan's choice of text for the contestants was unique, reflected our club's objectives, paid tribute to the founders of the club, and the current Executive. Nice touch Dan!

The Time Capsule, a very beautiful wooden box made especially for the occasion, was on stage to receive mementos from the past 40 years. President Dan Johnston Many members contributed various items including life members Ed Morgan VE3GX and Doreen Morgan VE3CGO, President Dan Johnston VA3JAR, Vice-President Susan Mogensen, Patricia Rowan VA3PUR, yours truly and others. Remember, if you have anything memorable for the Time Capsule, bring it to the next general meeting before it is sealed for 10 years. The Time Capsule will be opened by members of the Executive on the 50th Anniversary of Incorporation. If you were unable to attend, I video taped the meeting and a copy of the video tape will also be added to the Time Capsule before it is sealed. Another copy of the video tape will be available for loan to any members that were unable to attend and would like to see the celebrations. Just let me know if you would like to see it and I will get it into your hands on a first come first served basis.

Congratulations to all the members for contributing to this club for more than forty years! Hopefully, your investment of time and assistance in future years will keep our club viable, vibrant and maintain the OVMRC through many more years to come. As former President and current Vice-President Susan Mogensen VE3MOG always says, "It's your club, make it what you want it to be, participate."

MAY 1992 RAMBLER

The front page article "May I Repeat?" by Ed Sieb VE3RDZ consists of a Report of the Technical Committee. Ed noted the status of our repeater, VE3TWO, was examined and an in-depth report describing the specific costs, phasing and the features an upgrade might include were presented to members at the April General Meeting. He wrote our club is the largest in the area with the highest growth rate, our profile in the Amateur Radio community is very high and this suggests that our repeater should keep pace with our growth and the demand for more "air-time" on 2-Meters. It was considered inappropriate that our members not have access to modem, state-of-the-art repeater facilities. His Committee determined that serious upgrading of VE3TWO was urgently needed and had proposed three

Phases to accomplish the task. Phase 1- Immediate purchase and installation of a state-of-the-art repeater controller to provide for all present and future anticipated needs. Phase 2 - Move the repeater to a new site to provide increased range as well as other anticipated future expansions, such as UHF, 6-Meters, links, et. Phase 3 - Purchase new RF hardware for the new site. Install old RF equipment as a back-up service at the old site (580 Booth Street).

Phase 1 would begin immediately upon Club approval and a new controller would be purchased for approximately \$2800.00. The new controller would allow for an Autopatch, autodial of up to 240 numbers, reverse patch, talking S-meter, voice mail and mailboxes, voice bulletins, link interfaces, remote programming by computer and many other features. This controller was considered to be the most advance in the industry.

Ed invited the members to provide their reaction to the three phase proposal at the next General Meeting. He wanted to know if the membership would agree to proceed with the three-phase plan to improve the repeater or whether the repeater should just be left the way it is? He invited members to make their feelings know to the Executive by mail or phone or in person at the General Meeting in May and that the Club's decision would be based on their reaction.

The Secretary's Minutes, by Ted VE3KEH, record the names of the graduates of the 1991/1992 Radio Course including, Dave Murphy, Ron VE3UWR, Roger VE3XRR, Steve VE3RUU, Bob VE3UUH, Bob VE2RGK, Alan VE3TYJ, Pat VE3TZR, Jeff VE3WWH, Larry VE3WEH, Margaret VE3WIR and Lorraine.

The annual OVMRC Flea Market, Canterbury High School, April 11, 1992 was an unqualified success and more than \$1200 in profits were made. The event was thoroughly covered in a report by Ken Barry VE3KJB and Chuck King VE3PDK. They called it "A Super Event" with new equipment from ten commercial vendors and shack goodies from ninety private vendors. Despite a raging blizzard and atrocious driving conditions, four hundred or more eager shoppers showed up for the event. They noted that planning was the key to this successful event and it was started on April 12, 1991, the day after last year's Flea Market. Winston Hetherington VE3WTH operated the talk-in station on our club repeater VE3TWO.

Test-Bench a Big Attraction: Ralph Cameron VE3BBM operated a test bench and with his wide range of expertise and \$30,000 worth of test equipment, gave buyers an idea of the state of health of equipment they wanted to buy.

Live Fastscan Amateur Television Demonstration: Bill Westbrook VE3EKA manned the fixed station while the camera crew consisting of Norm Hull VE3JDJ and Ian McIntyre VE3CZ, produced full colour motion pictures with sound from a roving vehicle. The images of drifting snow, slippery driving and traffic snarls were impressive.

PacketCluster Demonstration: Ron Schwartz VE3VN rand demonstrations, explaining the TNC set-up, operations modes, and network features and advantages of this packet system.

Commercial Vendors: Several unique commercial vendors were there. Cipher Systems Design was selling computer hardware. World View Tim Inc. represented by Dwight Darling, was selling world clocks and Affir Motif, provided caps with machine-sewn names and Callsigns. Door Prizes included the Kenwood TH-77A dual band HT donated by Kenwood Electronics Canada Ltd. and Larry Woram VE3WLN was the lucky winner. Also an SWR meter donated by Bytown Marine was won by Dan Stanton VE3RDG. A subscription to The Canadian Amateur, donated by the Canadian Amateur Radio Federation, was won by Gerry Wells VE3CDS.

In closing, I hope to see you at our Flea Market, Saturday, May 4, 2002, at the Stittsville arena. Our Flea Market Chair, Jake Guertin VA3TQX and his committee consisting of James Poulin VA3JPX, Frank Stratton VE3YY and Don Raymond VE3DRO are still working hard to make it a grand success.


