the building and hand it over to the

retrofitting contractors. It is project time crunch for what's inside and outside.

interesting because most of us don't know about these roof top antennas. In fact, my guess is that only Maurice-André, VE3VIG, Ernie, VE3EJJ, and Darin, VE3OIJ know the antennas by their commercial name. On March 28th we found out that we could arrange to go on the roof to retrieve the antennas. So, by Monday March 30th Norm, VE3LC, Paul, VE3NJS, Joe, VE3EUS and moi, VE3HAZ were able to do a survey, took pictures and were told that we were not allowed within 2 feet of the roof's edge without a safety harness. Of course the 'safety' notice 'dialogue' came after we were seen hanging over the roof's edge examining our tower. The result is we will certainly comply with all the safety regulations / practices. On Wednesday April 1st the extraction team went in and did a rip torn job. (my humour). Maurice-André supplied an accurate list of OVMRC antennas and left others alone. The tower and the TH7DX Hygain antenna will have to have professionals to remove it due to the museum's safety requirements and the need for a crane. A letter was sent to the CSTM facilities manager asking for the museum to absorb the cost,

Meeting Minutes for March 19, 2015

Location: CASM classroom A

Call to order by President: Sandy Haggart/VE3HAZ.

Welcome to visitors/new amateur radio operators, Kim Campbell / VA3KMY, Kim is a graduate of our 2014 OVMRC course and Matt Crites / VA2XMC just passed his amateur radio exam given by Ernie Jury, VE3EJJ.

Introduction of the evening's presenter: Darin Cowan/VE3OIJ our club station manager. Darin outlined the various attributes of the more commonly used digital modes used within the amateur radio bands. The use of the visual spectrum images of these modes along with their audio characteristics proved effective in understanding the subject matter. Thanks Darin for your exchange of knowledge and experience.

Business portion:

1. **Budget motion** as published in the February and March Rambler for the expenditure of \$700 for storage locker for OVMRC assets from the closure of the CSTM and a \$100 for supplies for the June 6th OVMRC focus session to plan the 'new' OVMRC direction due to

being relocated from our 40 years residency at the CSTM.

- The motion was moved by our treasurer, Beth/VA3CEW;
- 2nd by Paul/VE3NJS;
- Passed unanimously.
- 2. **Membership report** by Joe / VE3EUS indicated membership is unchanged at 45.
- 3. Technical: Paul/VE3NJS and Norm, VE3LC reported on the pending-delivery of 2 Yaesu System Fusion repeaters purchased courtesy of Norm / VE3LC's while on vacation in Florida and his visit to the HamCation exposition. One repeater will replace the two metre equipment and the other will replace the 70 cm equipment. The System Fusion design/function will be able to handle both C4FM digital and conventional analogue FM signals; it will not be compatible with D-Star or DMR. This will provide the OVMRC a way to revive the VE3TWO repeater system with new and progressive equipment that should be of great interest to the Ottawa amateur community. A significant amount of testing will be required to bring this Yaesu System Fusion functionality into full use. Norm will be reimbursed the \$1,000.00 US by the OVMRC when the equipment is delivered hopefully by the next meeting. Paul reported the VE3TWO repeater antenna has been repaired and - the repeater is back in operation.
- 4. **Radio Course:** Norm / VE3LC announced that the 2014 radio course graduates will have a graduation ceremony at the next meeting April 16th.

- 5. **Asset Retrieval:** Joe / VE3EUS updated the club on the status of the retrieval of most of the club / VE3JW assets from the Science and Technology museum.
- A 5 x 10 storage locker has been rented to allow sorting and storage of these assets (old records, mementos, operational and surplus equipment, along with the 'might be of use stuff that we all keep';
- The sorting and resorting has 3 end goals: keep, resell, recycle:
- Over 10 trips were made retrieving the assets;
- The sorting and cataloguing still continues some resale items were presented at our flea market in February. Other resalable items when identified will be 1st offered to club members and then to the public via the OVMRC WEB site's Forum / Items for sale list;
- The OVMRC received some surplus amateur radio and other electronic items from Public Safety Canada. These items are being reviewed for functional use by OVMRC and the remaining items offered as is for a nominal cost. This donation was presented and graciously accepted as 'as is' government surplus;
- OVMRC is following up on missing items, like material in the radio course cabinet:
- The next retrieval items are the satellite tracking antenna from the museum's roof and the decision of how they will handle the tower which includes

our multi HF band beam antenna.

6. **ARRL Field Day:** Norm / VE3LC has agreed to coordinate the field day, June 27-28. We have a tentative agreement to set up on the Aviation and Space Museum grounds. Final decisions will be made when the snow clears. We will have proximity to the museum visitors for our communications trailer. Compliance with government bilingual requirement has been asked for and it is not seen as a problem for the participants,

7. Offsite planning: the

executive has schedule June 6th as a daylong planning session to discuss ideas and plan a focused direction for the next 2 + years. Interested members who are willing to participate with ideas and to work on the solutions are most welcome

8. Club Elections: Joe / VE3EUS is the election's coordinator. He can be reached via Email:

This position offers a unique opportunity for new HAMs to learn how the club functions and being involved with technical discussions providing a technical learning experience. 10. Next Meeting Presentation: Bert Zauhar, VE2ZAZ will giving a presentation "Broad Band HAMNet". This self-discovery system uses conventional 2.4 GHz WIFI routers and RF transceivers using special amateur developed software flashed into the equipment.

- 11. **Door prize:** Dave VE3ZZU won the door prize; the 50/50 prize of \$25.50 was won by our guest this evening, Matt / VA2XMC who subsequently joined OVMRC with his win fall. Welcome Matt.
- 12. **Mini flea market:** following the adjournment of the meeting a mini flea market was held
 - This was to 'off load' miscellaneous'stuff' that was destined for the dumpster.
 Surprisingly several items were sold for the benefit of our bank account;
 - Also on a consignment sale basis were hard and soft sided brief cases. The club received \$20 from the sales.

Soldering Course

Thanks to the organizational and presentation skills of Peter Carss, VE3XEM and Ernie Jury, VE3EJJ, the OVMRC conducted a special two evening Tutorial in Soldering techniques in March. Norm Rashleigh, VE3LC, also helped out. We had six new ham members attend the course; most had never soldered before. The course also

provided a refresher for three other long time OVMRC members. Each course attendee received a RG 58 coaxial jumper cable kit to assemble and solder using two PL 259 connectors. On the second session, the students worked on removing and re-soldering components from old surplus electronic circuit boards using solder suckers and solder wick.

Amazingly, nobody burnt their fingers, although the old 300 watt Weller soldering gun got a little too hot to handle after well exceeding its 1 minute on, and 4 minutes off duty cycle. Nevertheless, everybody had fun and the course was well received by all.

Utah Group Puts Broadband-Hamnet to Work for Food Project

A small band of Amateur Radio volunteers in Utah's Salt Lake Valley successfully used a broadband WiFi network set up on the 2.4 GHz amateur band to help coordinate the Boy Scouts of America's "Scouting for Food" project on March 21. in which Scouts collect items donated to a food bank. Local radio amateurs

provide both voice and digital mode communication.

This year for the first time they used a Broadband-HamnetTM (BBHN) system that coupled modified wireless router gear on amateur frequencies to create a peer-to-peer WiFi network to share audio and video over a generous patch of real estate. BBHN is a descendent of the former ARRL High Speed Multimedia (HSMM) Working Group efforts, earlier known as the "Hinternet" and pioneered by John Champa,



K8OCL (SK), and others in the early 2000s.

"[W]e would call it WiFi on
Steroids!" said David Baumanm,
KF7MCF. The Utah hams linked
13 nodes across the valley to form a
network "that is like a mini private
Internet," Bauman explained.
"They then used this network to
send live video and audio back to
the BSA Headquarters, showing
them what was happening at food
drop off sites and at the [truck
dispatch] headquarters. Bauman
called it "a huge step forward in
technology from the old days of

Morse Code." Retired clergyman Robert Jelf, KG7OHV, of Magna, headed up the team.


Just outside BSA Headquarters near the University of Utah, Brandon Bauman, KG7RWO, was able to watched via his laptop as volunteers miles away dropped off canned food items and as YRC freight dispatched trucks to pick-up sites around the valley. Brandon was part of an Amateur Radio group that assists the Boy Scouts in the Scouting for Food Project each year by providing communications. This marked the first time BBHN technology was used to support the project in the Salt Lake Valley. Their WiFi network, known as a wireless mesh network, was able to cover a large portion of the valley.

"The farthest point from our hub site was 8.5 miles across the city through a narrow path lined with lots of manmade objects for signals to bounce off," Jelf said. "While the mesh group was used to show video of the dispatch of trucks and of truck trailers at collection points within the hub site path, collection took place throughout the Wasatch Front area and elsewhere in Utah."
