At the November dinner meeting of the Ottawa Chapter of the QCWA (Quarter Century Wireless Association) I gave a presentation about "Teaching the OVMRC Amateur Radio Course" Most of the QCWA members got into amateur radio in their teens, myself included. Indeed, for most senior hams, amateur radio paved the way into radio, electronics and technical careers. In my presentation about the course, I went through the various topics and knowledge base that candidates need to know

nowadays for the Basic exam. This seemed of great interest to my audience many of whom have not kept abreast of the examination regime since the days they tried the test in the 1950's, 60's, and 70's. Because of the evolution of technology, digital transmission modes, sharing of radio spectrum, new amateur radio bands and all the conventions, rules and policy that now apply, it is my belief the amount of material that now must be learned by the amateur radio student is much more than years ago; albeit, Morse code proficiency is no longer required.

What is WSPR? WSPR (Weak Signal Propagation Reporter) Is a QRP transmitter/receiver system Transmitters automatically send precisely timed digital reports indicating location & power, usually <1 watt. Receivers decode signals received and send data via the Internet to a central server, which assembles a display showing the paths.













How does it work? × Signals are transmitted at precise intervals, usually 10 minutes. × Signal includes grid square, call sign, & signal power level. × Signal is very robust, capable of decoding down to the noise floor. × Server is capable of sorting by band, and call sign.
