



Radio Propagation Experiments during the Solar Eclipse 2017

As many folks already know, there will be a total eclipse of the sun seen across parts of the United States, August 21st. The following map shows the narrow path of totality:



The maximum view in Ottawa will be partial beginning on August 21st at 1:17 PM, maximum at 2:35 pm and ending at 3:48 PM with a duration of 2 hours, 31 minutes. It will not be spectacular visually in the Ottawa area especially if it is cloudy, however; we as radio amateurs should be interested in the effects on radio propagation during the transit from stations transmitting and receiving in and around the moving shadow across the USA. Under such conditions, it is speculated there will be a significant loss of the normal daytime ionization of the D layer from solar UV radiation allowing much better transient propagation of low frequency band signals. This, it is hoped, will be observed from data collected from WSPR beacons transmitting along and either side of the path of totality. Data will also be collected by the CW Reverse Beacon Network. Transmissions on 160 and 80 metres may show the greatest short time increase in propagation capability if the hypothesis proves true. It will be interesting if we see a moving enhancement of such signals originating from stations transmitting regularly as totality moves along the path. The HamSci organization will be sponsoring a Solar Eclipse QSO Party on Aug 21 from 1400 to 2200 UTC. For the Objective and Rules go to: hamsci.org/seqp-rules.

It's been another busy year with the OVMRC. The club's sponsored nets are continuing to enjoy strong participation from their respective loyal regulars.

The Pot Hole Net has its ups and downs, mostly due to awkward Sunday morning propagation through the seasons. Still, like clockwork, our dedicated NCOs stick with it to make it fun anyway. Some mornings the band is excellent. Thank you to both Ernie VE3EJJ, and Glenn VE3XRA for their continued efforts in keeping the historic net on the air!

The Pot Hole net will be closing for the summer as it has for many years. Participation tends to drop off, and band conditions at this time of year can make it difficult. The last net for this season will be held on Sunday June 18th, as the last weekend in June will be busy with Field Day. The Pot Hole net will recommence at 10 am local, Sunday September the 10th on 3760 kc.

The OVMRC 2 Meter Net has had another strong year with most nets

collecting 10-15 check-ins from a group of loyal regulars, newbies and a few visitors. Surprisingly, these hams return week after week despite Net Control's often sleepy ramblings. Tired or not, I haven't missed a net this year.

I can't say enough about our faithful repeater VE3TWO. The repeater does a great job of handling over an hour of nearly solid 'key-down' operation each week. Partway through the year, the club's technical guys decided to follow Yaesu's advice to reduce the repeater's output to 20 watts. Probably wise as TWO can be a busy machine with an analog net, two C4FM nets, as well as increasing regular traffic. Thankfully, the power reduction had little effect on the FM net, considering Net Control is located more than 60 km from the repeater.

In recent weeks a couple of the 2m net regulars have asked why the net shuts down for July and August. Often in summer participation dwindles as people find things to do elsewhere, enjoying the daylight and weather while they can. However, the FM net would probably keep enough interest to maintain respectable turnouts on Thursday evenings.

If the OVMRC 2 Meter Net is to run throughout the summer, it will require at least a couple of volunteer NCOs to fill in the gaps. Ideally, these volunteers would be club members willing to stick with the net through the regular season as well, to help with scheduling and adding variety to the operation. Otherwise the net will close for July and August, the final net being held Thursday the 29th of June at 8 pm local on repeater VE3TWO. Brief Review of this Year's Season of the OVMRC

- The Radio Course had an enrollment of 33 students plus one repeat student and a couple Basic hams repeating the course to upgrade their qualification.
- The Radio Course graduated 17 new amateurs with most achieving Honours qualification.
- Ken Evans, VE3EKN maintained and published in the Rambler a monthly log of checks-in of the Thursday evening OVMRC 2 mtr net and 80 mtr Pot Hole Net.
- The Club produced another run of Arrow type "J Pole" dual band antennas; this year 35 were made and sold providing a modest profit to the Club.
 Project success was thanks to Barry VE3NJK and Pete VE3XEM who acquired materials and prepared kits.
- The original repeater equipment located at 580 Booth St since 1978 was dismantled and the site abandoned. The work party was Norm VE3LC, Barry VE3NJK and Ken VE3EKN.

- The new Yaesu System Fusion repeater remains working well at the new Orleans site.
- The Club trailer was sold off to a Club member. Being old and in need of repair with no one to tow and look after it, it was considered more a liability than asset to the Club.
- Our October meeting featured a presentation by Paul Dufresne, VE3OTB on his development and operation of an APRS / SMS Messaging Gateway.
- Our November meeting featured a presentation by Bryan Rawlings, VE3QN on "Confirming Contacts".
- In place of a December meeting, a Club Christmas Dinner was organized by Sandy Haggart VE3HAZ at a local restaurant.
- Our January meeting featured a presentation by Ray Perrin, VE3FN on Microwave DXing.
- Our February meeting featured a presentation by Denis Rule, VE3BF on Yaesu Wires X Networking.
- Our March meeting featured a presentation by Richard Ferch, VE3KI on the Remote Control of your HF Station.

- Our April meeting featured a presentation by Dave Conn, VE3KL on the HF Wire Antennas.
- At the April Meeting, a presentation of an Appreciation Award was made to Bill Hall VA3WMH for years of service to the Club for producing the Rambler Newsletter.
- An April Workshop was conducted by Barry VE3NJK and Norm VE3LC to test performance of VHF/UHF FM radios.
- Norm VE3LC did a May meeting briefing to members about plans for Field Day 2017 and the Upcoming Transmitter (Fox) Hunt Event
- The Club sponsored an End of May Fox Hunt Event using two MicroFox 15 mW 2 mtr beacon transmitters purchased earlier in the year by the Club. 18 folks attended.
- The Club will be hosting a Field Day Planning meeting joint with the OARC June 12.
- Field Day to be hosted at the RCMP Camp and Conference Centre, Long Island.

By Law 5.1.2: The Annual General Meeting shall be a Regular General Meeting held in June of each year. The business of the Annual General Meeting shall consist of the election of Executive

By Law 3.2: The Executive Officers of the Club shall be the Directors and the Chairs of the Standing Committees collectively.

By Law 9.5: No Director shall be eligible to serve for more than three (3) consecutive terms (of one year) in the same Director position.

The incumbent Directors and Standing Committee Chairpersons are willing and able to stand for another term. Others may be nominated by the membership at the AGM in which case a vote of persons for the position will take place.

Track the C3 Expedition using WSPR (weak signal propagation reporter)

The Canada C3 Expedition Voyage is a Canada 150 Signature Project. It is an Expedition of the Canadian 67 metre Icebreaker Polar Prince that left Toronto on June 1 and will travel up the St Lawrence and East Coast of Canada, across the Northwest Passage, around Alaska and through the Bering Strait and down the West Coast to Victoria, BC., all in 150 days commemorating 150 years of Canada as a Nation. Through a team of Canadian Radio Amateurs lead by Barrie Crampton, VE3BSB of Perth, the C3 Expedition Ship has been outfitted with a ORPLabs WSPR beacon transmitter that will be making sequenced WSPR protocol transmissions on the 20, 30 and 40 metre bands. Other members of the team project included: John VE3CXL, Pierre VE3KTB, Alex VE1RUS, Mitch VE3OT, Luc VE3JGL, David VE3KL, Jeff VE3EFF and Phil VE3CIQ.
