e had a great turn out for our April mini flea market meeting with 43 + folks attending including several guests. While lots of good stuff got traded, many folks also enjoyed the show and tell and coffee and donuts and of course, the good camaraderie.

May meeting VE3 – SOTA Presentation.

For our May meeting, our feature presentation will be by Michael Babineau, VE3WMB telling about the VE3 "SOTA" Association. For those not familiar with "SOTA", it is an acronym for "Summits on the Air". SOTA is an award program for radio amateurs that encourages portable operation from high places such as high hills and mountain tops. There are awards for "activators" (those who ascend to the summits) and "chasers" (who either operate from home, a local hill top or even activators on other summits). Evidently, for the last year, there has been qualification process that has been initiated by a group of Ontario SOTA enthusiasts for 1000 Ontario summits that now can be activated for the UK based world wide SOTA awards program; this came to fruition on April 1st.

Mike and his presentation for our May meeting will tell all about it.

CN Bike Ride for CHEO, May 6

A number of OVMRC members volunteered with the Emergency Measures Radio Group to provide communications support for the CN Bike Ride for CHEO; these folks included Steve VA3MPS, Norm VE3LC, Nicole VE3GIQ, Dave VE3ZZU ,Frank VE2KOI, Jeffery VA3PEW, Arthur VA3BIT and Glenn VE3XRA. The Sunday morning weather for the event was near perfect and record numbers registered to participate in the 70, 35, and 15 Km bike riding events along with 2 and 5 km walking routes. Communications between check points and net control operators was conducted over the VE3OCE repeater. Progress along the routes was given by several radio amateurs operating bicycle mobile and reporting into Net Control as a patrol and end of route sweep rider ensuring the route could return safely to vehicular traffic after the last riders were clear of the route. Several bike mobile ops were reporting their progress along the route by APRS location beaconing which was displayed at the Net Control Operations (Continued on page 3)

Tour of CHU – Scheduled for the evening of Wednesday, May 30.

We have scheduled with NRC officials a tour of their Time Signal Station, CHU located on Greenbank just north of Fallowfield Road. CHU transmits on 3.33, 7.85 and 14.67 MHz.

We are advised they can accommodate two groups of about 12 people for each time, one at 6:30 PM and the other an hour later at 7:30 PM. Ideally, we should car pool to the greatest extent so we go to the site with the least number of cars as parking in the station driveway (as seen in the picture) will be limited. So far we have 16 on our tour list from those that signed up last meeting; we will be re-confirming with these folks and add to the list at the May meeting with others that want to attend as well.

Monthly Repeater Tests are conducted by Dave VE3KMV on the first Wednesday of each month at 8 pm on VE3OCE 146.880 MHz – (136.5 Hz tone). From initial contact on VE3OCE, you'll be asked to test VE3EMV/East 146.985 MHz – (100 Hz@ tone), VE3EMV/West 145.210 MHz – (123 Hz tone), VE3OFS 146.670 MHz – (123 Hz tone) and VE3OCE 443.8000 MHz + (136.5 Hz tone). It is advisable that all the EMRG frequencies be programmed into your radio. All check ins are welcome. emrg.ca/repeaters.htm



Clare Fowler, VE3NPC

Many radio amateurs in Ottawa know Clare Fowler, VE3NPC; he has been a long time member of both the Ottawa Amateur and the Ottawa Valley Mobile Radio Clubs and member of the Ottawa Chapter of the Quarter Century Wireless Association. In February, Clare celebrated his 90th birthday. For years, Clare's specialty in the hobby has been satellite communications. He has often been the member of the Club's June field day team providing his satellite station and expertise to make these important

extraterrestrial bonus contacts for the club. We hope he will be available again this year.

Clare has been a radio amateur since 1948 and held call signs VE6JT, VE8AF, VE7YF, VE3AAU, VE3BTC and since 1983, VE3NPC. While VE8AF, Clare built his own 26 tube dual conversion receiver. He also built his own Panoramic signal receiver display. As well he's built all his satellite antennas including 2 m quagis, helix antennas for 70 cm and 23 cm and a 1.2 metre dish antenna for the 13 cm band. Clare has many satellite operating awards including DXCC (# 64 SAT-211 confirmed) and WAZ (# 12 SAT – 40 confirmed). Clare has (Continued on page 8)

(Continued from page 7) authored several articles relating to field measurements on his helix antennas that were published in the AMSAT journal.


At the March Break 2018 display of Amateur Radio at the Aviation and Space Museum, Clare donated his home brew 2 metre / 70 cm helix satellite antenna array to display at the show and be available again for field day this year.

Clare now lives in his own apartment as part of the Billings Lodge retirement residence. There, he has set up again his ham shack and still has the capability to get on the air and make satellite contacts. His OSL card above shows him at the controls of his present station. His home brew Panadapter built years ago is still in service.

When we visited Clare at his retirement resident QTH, he showed us his home brew all band HF AM/CW transmitter he built in the early 1950's and used for a number of years. Far from the technology now available, it was state-of-the-art back then. Enjoy the pictures of Clare's transmitter that he is still proud to show and tell about.
