

Field Day Results

As most of the Club Members are aware, the Covid pandemic prevented us from gathering together for our normal Class 2A operation this year on the grounds of the Aviation and Space Museum. To salvage the annual Field Day event, the ARRL encouraged operation from home stations or from a solo portable operation by individuals and submit their results along with indicating their radio club affiliation. As part of the publishing of scores for the various "Classes", the scores from all individuals indicating the same club name were added together and shown as a club score total. Also for this year, again to promote "stay at home" participation, the ARRL waived the rule prohibiting D class (those operating at home using commercial home AC power) to count their contacts towards their

All individual scores shown on page 5 were obtained from the digital version of the December issue of QST. The sum of the individual scores was 11,847; this agrees with the figure published in the magazine for the OVMRC Club Total. Of course, the individual scores are not just points for QSOs but also include point multipliers and bonus points according to the ARRL Field Day Rules. As a matter of comparison. our total Club Score far exceeds the score we got for our normal 2A operation just over 4000 points for each of the last two years.

OVMRC "Life" Member, Maurice-André Vigneault, VE3VIG/VA2MA is appointed to The Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame.

ongratulations to Maurice-André Vigneault, VE3VIG for his appointment this year to the Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame (CARHOF). The announcement was made by a special bulletin from Radio Amateurs of Canada, November

19th. To be appointed to the CARHOF, a nominated person must have performed significant service over many years to enhance the well being of Amateur Radio. All those that have known the Maurice-André through amateur radio have really appreciated his enthusiasm, dedication and countless hours spent promoting the hobby.

Maurice-André obtained his Amateur Radio licence in 1990 following a 38 year career in the Canadian Armed Forces specializing in radio, radar and teaching electronics. He soon became involved in the Ottawa Valley Mobile Radio Club and through that association, Maurice-André became the lead and manager of the exhibit amateur radio station VE3JW at Science and Technology Museum between 1996 to 2014 (18 years) logging more than 8,000 hours of volunteer service. While on duty at VE3JW. Maurice-André told members of the passing public all about amateur radio, taking time especially with the young visitors to the Museum to hopefully spark an interest in the science and the technology of radio communications and a pursuit of amateur radio as a foundation for a career in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math).

To promote the "WOW" factor with youth about amateur radio

and its ability to communicate with the astronauts, Maurice-André became involved in amateur space communications. He served both as the Canadian Delegate to AMSAT (The Amateur Radio Satellite Corporation) and with ARISS (Amateur Radio on the International Space Station). His volunteer work with ARISS included the Working Group responsible for the ARISS Educational Outreach program and the School Selection Committee for choosing from the many Canadian proposals submitted by schools wanting to host gatherings of students for scheduled communications by amateur radio with astronauts aboard International Space Station. Maurice-André also introduced youth to amateur radio through his participation in both "Guides-On-The-Air" (GOTA) and the "Jamboree-On-The-Air" (JOTA) for the Scouts.

With his acquired experience in amateur satellite communications, Maurice-André developed and taught a well received course on the subject to Ottawa area amateurs.

Maurice-André was also an active amateur radio operator at-large away from his home QTH that included participation in the communications for the Trans-Canada Trail Relay (2000), special event "activations" of locks on the Rideau Canal upon its designation as a UNESCO World Heritage site (2007) and activations of locations along the Champlain Trail during

the 400th Anniversary Celebrations (2008) of the founding of Quebec City. Maurice-André was also very much involved a providing vital amateur radio communications support during the ice storm of 1998 in Cumberland, Kilmar (north of Montebello) and Navan.

Maurice-André has been a prolific author of amateur radio articles for the OVMRC Rambler newsletter, for the RAC "The Canadian Amateur" magazine, for the AMSAT Journal and a contributor to the RAQI publication.

Over the years with the OVMRC, Maurice-André has participated in numerous Field Day events providing bonus points for satellite communications, has been awarded recognition in many club "Home Brew" competitions, and has been selected as the Club's "Amateur of the Year" award for 1999 and 2003 and received a "Life Membership" in the Club in 2005.

We thank all those involved in the OVMRC that initiated and contributed to the nomination process of Maurice-André VE3VIG/VA2MA as a candidate for this year's Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame award. We are grateful to the "Trustees of the Hall" for their selection of Maurice-André for this well deserved honour.

Maurice-André follows other members of the OVMRC appointed to the Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame, most notably Bill Wilson VE3NR (SK) in 1997 and Ralph Cameron VE3BBM (life member of the Club) for his "Award of Honour" in 1993. The "Award of Honour" has been discontinued but all recipients are accorded recognition and honour in the "Hall".

Doug Leach, VE3XK (SK) also appointed to the Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame.

e would be remiss if we did not acknowledge another appointment to the CARHOF this year. Doug Leach, VE3XK (SK) passed away in January of this year after many years of continued service to amateur radio in Canada. He became a radio amateur in 1954 as a teenager with the call sign VE3DWK and later obtained his two letter call VE3XK in 1998. Although Doug was an active amateur for most of his lifetime, he became particularly active in 1995 promoting and serving the amateur radio community following his career as an executive in electronic instrumentation marketing and sales. He served in the formative years of Radio Amateurs of Canada and

authored many of RAC administrative manuals for the proper running of the organization. He was the author of the "RAC Operating Manual". He was also instrumental in developing the RAC Affiliated Club Program, the RAC Foundation and the RAC Liability Insurance Program for affiliated clubs. Doug developed business plans for RAC and served as the Web Master for several years. He also served as RAC Acting President in 1999 for several months and was the RAC Director North and East between 2001 and 2004.


Doug was also a very active radio amateur achieving DXCC on most amateur HF bands and modes. Doug received the QCWA "Meritorious Award" in 2007 and served as QCWA Chapter 70 as historian and web master since 2007 until his passing this year. Locally, he was a member of the Ottawa Amateur Radio Club and West Carleton Amateur Radio Club where he served on the executive and where he was responsible for building the 6 m, 2 m, 1.25 m, and 70 cm beacons operated by the Club. Doug was very serious about amateur radio. Besides RAC, he also held current memberships in the ARRL and QCWA.

Doug was nominated to the Canadian Amateur Radio Hall of Fame (posthumously) by Chapter 70 of the QCWA and appointed to the Hall on November 19th.

• OVMRC Field Day Results: Norm VE3LC provided an ARRL summary of the scores achieved by the 22 club operators who worked Field Day last June. Together, the aggregate Club points total reported by ARRL was 11,847. Results are available in the December issue of QST Magazine.

• Finance and Membership Report: Nicole, VE3GIQ noted there are 90 paid members as of the meeting date plus 5 life and 1 honorary member for a total of 96 OVMRC members on the Active Roster.
