From initial contact on VE3OCE, you'll be asked to test VE3EMV/East 146.985 MHz – (100 Hz@ tone), VE3EMV/West 145.210 MHz – (123.0 Hz tone), VE3OFS 146.670 MHz – (136.5 Hz tone), VE3OCE 443.8000 MHz + 5 (136.5 Hz tone) and VE3EMU 444.9500 + 5 (136.5 Hz tone). It is advisable that all the EMRG frequencies be programmed into your radio. All check ins are welcome.

3. Approval of minutes from previous meeting:

MOTION: Moved by Tim Bailey, VE3TXB and seconded by Bill Henderson, VA3HWA that the minutes of the previous meeting held Wednesday, May 19, 2021, be approved.

4. Projects, Haves, Wants and Announcements:

Members should log all contacts and submit on line and include their affiliation with the "Ottawa Valley Mobile Radio Club". Individual scores will be shared and totalled later in the summer to determine how the Club performed overall.

Club Repeater VE3TWO – Plans to Co-locate with VE3OCE

As most OVMRC Club members know by now, the Club was given 30 days notice to remove the VE3TWO repeater equipment from the RCMP tower site in Orleans. This also included former RCMP amateur radio club repeater VE3MPC. Both repeaters ceased operation from that site July 23rd, 2021. There was no recourse since the MOU agreement with the RCMP stipulated that removal of the equipment could be asked at anytime and for any reason; we understand there was a need to make way for new equipment to be installed at the site and antennas on the tower. Because of commitments the Club made to provide check point communications for the MS Bike Tour at the end of August, we had asked Marc, VE3BOE if we could temporarily install the VE3TWO repeater equipment at his home QTH just north of the village of Metcalfe.

Marc graciously agreed to the installation that utilizes his GP-6 antenna atop his 81 foot tower. That said, shortly after the repeater was placed into service at Marc's place, Nicole, VE3GIQ was informed that the MS Bike tour event was cancelled because the organizers were unable to obtain the necessary permits due to the ongoing Covid situation. The VE3TWO equipment remains in operation at Marc's place and provides good coverage south and east of Ottawa; however, it is not an ideal location to provide coverage in the City of Ottawa proper for the OVMRC Thursday evening net.

VE3MPC remains out of service at the present time with equipment stored in my garage.

For a permanent home to VE3TWO and VE3MPC we approached Peter Gamble, VE3BQP who is the man in charge of the EMRG amateur repeaters located on several Fire Station towers across town. Peter was favourable to co-locating the

VE3TWO repeater equipment at the site of VE3OCE on the Fire Station tower at Alta Vista and Randal. He was also favourable to locating VE3MPC at the east end Fire Station tower on Charlemagne just east of 10th Line. For this to happen, provisioning of multicoupling will be necessary to connect to the existing VHF antenna on the respective towers. This work will be done commercially and would be under the direction of Peter. We will have to be patient for the necessary antenna port connections to be made; these are contingent on the availability of the necessary filtering components. In the meantime, Peter VE3BOP has given us permission to use VE3OCE (146.880 – offset using 136.5 Hz tone) to conduct our OVMRC Thursday evening net at

Amateur Radio Basic Level Certification Course

Norm VE3LC sent the following email message out to folks that had made inquiries over the past year about wanting to register for an amateur radio course available from the OVMRC.

HotSpots, DMR and Brandmeister Password to Access the System

For those that operate a DMR "HotSpot" and access the Brandmeister System, as of October 1st, 2021, your HotSpot will no longer be able to access the "Master Server" until you set the a HotSpot Security access password using your Brandmeister "Self-Care" account and match the same password in the setup of your HotSpot. For some folks, this may mean establishing a Self Care account on the Brandmeister system for the first time. There may be different mechanisms for setting this same password on the various makes and models of hotspots, but for folks that operate a HotSpot with the popular "Pi-Star" operating system, your access password will be in the following field:
